File format and size	Use Microsoft word DOC or DOCX format. Maximum file size should be 3 Mb.
Length	Between 6 and 10 pages, format the paper according to the requirements.
Language	Please write your text in English. Your manuscript has to be spelled and checked prior to the submission. Submissions are not copyedited before publication.
Font	Times New Roman, 11 pt inside the main text. Please use Insert → Symbol function in your word processor to write symbols or equations.
Layout and spacing	Paper Size: B5 (18.2 x 25.7 cm) Orientation: Portrait Margins (Top, Bottom, Left, Right): 2.0 cm each Text Alignment: Justified Line Spacing: Single Font: Times New Roman, 11 pt (Main text) Spacing Before: 0 pt Spacing After: 0 pt Do not insert header, footer or page numbers. Do not format text in multiple columns. Do not indent paragraphs. Do not use multiple spaces.

Title	The title should be specific, descriptive, concise, and comprehensible to the readers. Use upper case, bold letters, and centered. Limited to 200 characters. (Use style: Title of the article)
Author list	Please write author and co-author names in the following order: first name, last name. Each author must have an affiliation.

	<p>(Use style: Name and surname)</p> <p>Different affiliations should be marked in superscript (^{a, b, c}...). The affiliation includes university (institute, company), faculty, department, city, and country. Do not list academic ranks, addresses and emails. Authors are expected to consider carefully the list and order of the authors before submitting their manuscript.</p> <p>Only corresponding author should provide an e-mail address. Add asterisk in superscript * to mark corresponding author.</p> <p>(Use style: Affiliation)</p>
Abstract	<p>The abstract should describe the main objectives of the study, provide information about the methodology applied and summarize the most important results and their conclusions. The abstract should not exceed 450 words and should not include citations.</p> <p>(Use style: Abstract)</p>
Keywords	<p>List the keywords after the abstract. The list should be presented horizontally and should include 3-5 keywords that reflect the content of the manuscript. The keywords should be separated by commas. Only proper nouns, adjectives and abbreviations should be capitalized.</p> <p>(Use style: Keywords)</p>
Main text	<p>Font: Times New Roman, 11 pt, Justified</p> <p>Line spacing: single, Widow/Orphan control, Style: Show in the Styles gallery</p> <p>(Use Style: Paragraph)</p>
Headings	<p>Headings are written in upper case, bold letters.</p> <p>(use style: Chapter)</p> <p>Sub-headings are written in sentence case, bold letters. Limit manuscript sections and sub-sections to 2 heading levels.</p> <p>(Use style: Subsections)</p>
Tables	<p>Tables should be located at appropriate place inside the text. Leave one single-spaced blank line before and after the tables.</p> <p>All tables should be numbered and untitled and should be referred in the text.</p> <p>Table number and title should be placed above and outside the table.</p> <p>(Use style: Table title)</p> <p>Tables must be created in Microsoft Word and should not be embedded images or objects. Maximum table size width is 14.2 cm. They could be autofit to window. Table content should be centered. Tables which are too long or too wide for a single page may be typed in a smaller font size or continued on the next page.</p> <p>(Use style: Content of the tables)</p>
Figures	<p>Figures include graphs, charts, maps, drawings, and photographs. Figures should be located at appropriate place inside the text. Leave one</p>

	<p>single-spaced blank line before and after a figure. All figures should have figure numbers and titles and should be referred to the text. A figures number and title should be placed below and outside the figure.</p> <p>(Use style: Figure title)</p> <p>Figures must be of high quality and should fit on one page.</p> <p>Figures should be inserted inside the text as .jpeg or another image format, and not as an embedded excel document.</p>
Equations	<p>Equations should be located at appropriate place inside the text. Leave one single-spaced blank line before and after the equation. All equations should have equations numbers and should be referred to the text. An equation number should be placed in line with the equations inside the brackets, (1).</p> <p>(Use style: Equation number title)</p> <p>Figures must be high quality and should fit on one page.</p> <p>Equations should be inserted inside the text using Microsoft office equation.</p>
Abbreviations	<p>Define abbreviations upon first appearance in the text. Keep abbreviations to a minimum.</p>
Footnotes	<p>Footnotes are not permitted. Please refer to the main text and link it to the reference list.</p>
Acknowledgments	<p>List acknowledgments and funding sources.</p> <p>For the acknowledgment title, use style: chapter.</p> <p>For the acknowledgment text, use Style: Paragraph.</p>
